REPORT AGENDA

YEA Update

Ty Jones gave the YEA update stating the account balance as of March 31, 2023 was a little over \$4.4 million. We currently have two newly vested schools; Congratulations to Boise High School and Capital High School. This brings the total of vested schools to 75. The next meeting is scheduled for Monday, May 1st.

Dairy West Update

Ty Jones reported the meeting with Dairy West went really well and they will be looking at the dairy passes and how they are distributed. Next year we will be celebrating our 40th year of partnership with Dairy West and the Dairy Farmers of Idaho. They have been such a fantastic organization to work with and we are very fortunate to have them.

Officials Update

Darren Krzesnik presented the officials report stating they were very thankful for the hotel accommodations which were great this year ~ a big thank you to Mindy for making the arrangements. A few items were mentioned to the board for consideration which included shot clock training for the officials and looking at the criteria for lifetime passes including the procedure of requesting one.

Marketing Update

Ty Jones went over the marketing update stating we had really good attendance at all of winter tournaments with a total attendance number slightly over 87,000. Over 4,500 sweatshirts were purchased and a total of 34,272 milks were distributed thanks to Dairy West. We have a couple of new corporate sponsors; Centurion and Idaho Air National Guard. We are also continuing the sponsored programs; Athlete of the Week, presented by Northwest Toyota and Team of the Month, sponsored by Les Schwab Tires.

Loomis & Lapann Insurance

Ty Jones went over our insurance plan and the increases that we will be seeing next year.

2023 State Cheer and Dance

Mike Federico and Ty Jones reported on State Dance and Cheer stating Lisa Hahle did an outstanding job managing the event and everything ran smoothly. The total income was up slightly from last year however so were the total expenses. Altogether, it was a great event with no issues.

2023 Girls Real Dairy Shootout

Mike Federico reported on Girls State Basketball stating our tournament managers did a fantastic job. We didn't have any issues and had a lot of positive feedback from schools. The financials were close to what they have been and overall, we had some really great tournaments. It was noted there were a lot of schools that didn't have their team scores in the program. It is imperative that coaches get scores entered in a timely manner.

2023 State Wrestling Tournament

Ty Jones reported State Wrestling was held at the Ford Idaho Center. We had a brand new tournament manager, Todd Cady, who did a fantastic job. A huge thank you for all the workers; we had a great crew and received a lot of positive feedback. Gate receipts were up a little bit from last year as were the on-site expenses which were up about \$25,000. Overall, it was a great tournament.

2023 Boys Real Dairy Shootout

Ty Jones reported on Boys State Basketball stating all of the managers did an outstanding job and there were very few issues. The overall income was down from last year, however, last year was such an anomaly it's hard to compare. All in all, we had great tournaments and again a huge thank you to all of managers.

2023 State Debate

Mike Federico reported State Debate was held at Rigby High School this year. A big thank you to Brock Sondrup and the administration at Rigby, they did a phenomenal job especially with the snow removal. This was the first year with the new schedule and we received a lot of positive feedback. Everything went smooth and there was only one grievance the whole tournament.

Schools of Excellence – Mid Year Standing

Ty Jones reported on the Schools of Excellence stating Julie is still compiling everything. Make sure to get your items in.

Winter Concussion Numbers

Ty Jones reported on the winter concussion numbers. There are still about 10 schools that have not submitted their numbers and fines will be issued.

MaxPreps

Mike Federico went over the MaxPreps report which showed by in large most schools that are ranked high at the start of the tournament do better. Input was gathered from coaches, administrators and AD's and overwhelmingly most thought MaxPreps was better than the old system. However, they did think some things could be tweaked with the majority wanting the district tournaments included. There was some frustration with some scores not being entered correctly so it is imperative that schools get their scores entered accurately and in a timely manner. More information will be gathered and recommendations given in June.

2. **Tournament Representation and Bracketing** – The below proposal for tournament representation and bracketing was discussed and will be kept on the discussion agenda for the June Board of Directors meeting.

These guidelines are for volleyball, soccer, softball, and basketball.

The four highest ranked conference champions qualify for the state tournament. The last lowest ranked district champion and the next 7 highest ranked teams according to Max preps will play for the final 4 spots in a single elimination tournament. The highest seeds will be matched with lowest seeds where possible. However, minimizing travel is a priority and as such neutral courts are preferred. Participating teams will be responsible for arranging the location of the neutral court, start time of game, and other pertinent information related to the game.

3. **Classification Committee Report** - Tol Gropp presented the new classification and alignment which would eliminate the 1A split.

2-5 REPRESENTATION

2-5-1 State tournament representation in volleyball, soccer, swimming, football, basketball, wrestling, track, softball and tennis will be determined for a two-year period based on a percentage of schools in that classification. Note: Representation may be altered periodically to reflect the historical representation of each classification.

- a. Representation to state competition will be determined by the percentage of the number of teams from a district or region that qualify for state tournament competition.
- b. State play-in games should be used when the percentage of the representation between districts or regions can be more equitable.
- c. When there are three or more schools within a region or district, representation should be at least 1.5 if possible.
- d. When state play-in games are used, they should be played at neutral sites and between regions or districts of the state that would not cause unrealistic travel requirements. Note: It is considered unrealistic travel if a team cannot travel to a play-in site, compete and return to their own school in one day.

2-5-2 State tournament representation for cross country, golf, speech, debate, drama, cheer and dance will be determined yearly by the total number of team and/or individual finishers at a district/regional qualifying competition.

2-5-3 State tournament brackets for girls' soccer, boys' soccer, volleyball, girls' basketball, boys' basketball and softball will be seeded using MaxPreps regular season rankings. Each school year, brackets will be flipped to balance the bracket time slots. Based on a 4-year rotation. The higher seed will be the home team in all contests.

8-16 NON-TRADITIONAL STUDENT

8-16-1 To be in compliance with the section of Idaho Code 33-203 that provides for dual enrollment, the following interpretation will be used: Students who are enrolled in a nonpublic school shall be allowed to enroll in a public school for dual enrollment purposes. To be eligible for athletics or specific activities in the public school, the dual enrolled student must meet the following criteria:

- a. The student must reside with a parent or guardian in the attendance area of the public school for which the student will participate.
- b. The student must comply with the same rules and requirements that apply to any student's participation in the same activity with the exception of Rule 8-1 -Academic and Full Time Enrollment.
- c. In order for any nonpublic school student or public charter school student to participate in nonacademic public school activities for which public school students must demonstrate academic proficiency or eligibility, the nonpublic school or public charter school student shall demonstrate composite grade-level academic proficiency on any state board of education recognized achievement test, portfolio, or other mechanism as provided for in state board of education rules. Additionally, a student shall be eligible if he achieves a minimum composite, core or survey test score within the average or higher than average range as established by the test service utilized on any nationally-normed test. Demonstrated proficiency shall be used to determine eligibility for the current and next following school year. School districts shall provide to nonpublic students who wish to take state tests or other standardized tests given to all regularly enrolled public school students. Definition of Portfolio: A collection of materials that documents and demonstrates a student's academic and work-based learning. Although there is no standard format for a portfolio, it typically includes many forms of information that exhibit the student's knowledge, skills, and interests. By building a portfolio, students can recognize their own growth and learn to take increased responsibility for their education. Teachers, mentors, and employers can use portfolios for assessment purposes and to record educational outcomes. An example of a portfolio evaluation instrument, is on the IHSAA website, idhsaa.org
- d. It shall be the responsibility of the student to make all arrangements to take the required test and provide the principal of the school with the results of the test prior to being granted athletic eligibility at the public high school.

***A region cannot host two years in a row unless both schools are from that region.**

The final decision in setting sites, dates and time for each state championship game will be made by IHSAA Representatives and will be finalized by 10:00 a.m. the Sunday prior to the state championship game.

Selection Criteria:

A. Factors determining the site of a state championship game are:

1. Idaho State University – There may be at least three games, and possibly four, scheduled at Holt Arena. Two games should be scheduled on Friday. The remaining game or games will be scheduled on Thursday or Saturday, with times to be determined by ISU’s football schedule.
2. University of Idaho — There may be a maximum of three games per day scheduled at the Kibbie Dome. If possible, games should be scheduled for Friday afternoon and evening. Game times and dates will be determined by U of I’s football schedule.
3. Boise State University — There may be two games per day played at Dona Larson/ Albertsons Stadium. Game times and dates will be determined by the Boise State football schedule.

B. Other factors determining the site of a state championship game are:

1. Travel - loss of instruction time for the two participating teams.
2. Geographical rotation based upon recent participation of the district from which the teams are participating.
3. A region may not host a state championship game two years in a row unless both teams are from the same region
4. If No. 2 and No. 3 are in conflict with each other, No. 3 will take precedence over No. 2.
5. Availability of lodging and meals for teams, support groups and spectators.
6. Availability of the site to set reasonable game times. No game may be scheduled to start after 9:00 p.m. The team traveling the farthest distance will get first choice of game time.

 - All teams would play two days minimum
 - Decreased number of game management workers
 - Decreased costs for tournament management
 - Increased costs to schools by adding day
 - Increased costs for officials (hotels)
 - More of a showcase tournament
 - Fewer officials (lines) can cover matches
 - Fresh officials – each official would work less matches
 - Consistent with basketball/soccer/baseball/wrestling/softball tournaments

2022 OSAA Adopted Rules

With the NFHS Points of Emphasis on Sportsmanship and Targeting/Defenseless Player, the OSAA has included these 2 NEW OSAA adopted rules:

1. ONE VOICE from the BENCH POLICY – The voice shall either be the head coach or their ONE designee.
 - A. Initial violation shall be penalized under Rule 9-8-1a, b, c, or d AND shall include a warning to the head coach.
 - B. Subsequent violations shall be penalized to both the offending non-player AND the head coach with only one 15-yard penalty enforced.

2. Wrap-up Tackle requirement: To make the game safer, the wrap-up tackle will be required when taking down a defenseless in the following situations:
 - A. Rule 2-32-16b – Against a receiver attempting to catch a pass who has not had time to clearly become a runner.
 - B. Rule 2-32-16c – Against the intended receiver of a pass in the action during and immediately following an interception or potential interception.
 - c. Rule 2-32-16e – Against a kickoff or punt returner attempting to catch or recover a kick, or one who has completed a catch or recovery and has not yet had time to protect himself or has not clearly become a runner.
 - d. No player shall execute forceful contact against a player described in 2-32-16b, 2-32-16c or 2-31-16e that is not;
 1. Incidental contact as a result of making a play on the ball; or
 2. Initiated with an open hand push; or
 3. A wrap-up style tackle or an attempt to tackle the receiver by wrapping the arms around the receiver. Any contact other than the 3 stated situations above shall be interpreted as a violation of UNR 9-4-3g and assessed a 15-yard penalty.
