REPORT AGENDA

YEA Update

Julie Hammons reported the YEA portfolio is just shy of reaching \$5 million. As of October 31, 2021 the total was \$4,980,697. We had a great jamboree season. There were 32 fall jamborees bringing in an income of over \$20,000. For winter, there are 39 jamborees scheduled with a projected income of approximately \$15,000. Total number of fully vested schools is 71 with 6 schools in the 80% range. The YEA Board did not take action on exceeding 100% vestment level and will continue to discuss this topic at the next meeting.

Dairy West Update

Ty Jones reported on Dairy West stating they have been a great sponsor for us and we are very pleased to be continuing our partnership.

Officials Update

Darren Krzesnik gave the officials update stating they have put together a committee that consists of an official representative from all 6 districts. This committee will gather and provide to the board any information and/or issues that may arise throughout the state. A few topics of concern included low official numbers and possibly waiving registration fees, reimbursements for traveling crews and coverage for week day games.

Marketing Update

Zach Hoffman gave a big thank you to Dairy West and all the Idaho dairy farm families for being our official sponsor of all our state events. Milk was handed out at state cross country, state soccer and at Holt Arena for state football. In addition to Dairy West's sponsorship, we are also pleased to have back the sponsorship of the Idaho Army National Guard this year. We have also secured three new sponsors that include the Idaho Department of Health and Welfare - Division of Public Health, eTeamSponsor and the U.S. Marine Corps. We are definitely excited to have these three new sponsors as part of our association.

2021 State Soccer Tournament

Julie Hammons reported State Soccer was held in the Treasure Valley and a big thank you went out to all of the managers for their time and hard work. The number of 5A sites was reduced from three to two which was a good improvement. There were a few concerns regarding sites and crowd control along with the NFHS network streaming games. Max Preps was used for the first time this year and caused a few concerns; however, we will continue tracking the percentages. Financially, state soccer had a great year and was up about \$20,000 - keeping in mind we had a ticket price increase.

2021 State Cross Country

Ty Jones reported State Cross Country was held at Eagle Island this year and thanked, manager, Tim Severa along with everyone that helped with this event. There was a minor computer glitch with the 5A races and they had to be scored by hand. This took a little extra time but overall, it was a good day. Admissions were up quite a bit as were the expenses. Next year it will be in Lewiston – call now to reserve rooms! A survey will be sent out shortly to determine if it should be a one day event or two day event.

2021 State Volleyball Tournament

Mike Federico reported State Volleyball was held up in north Idaho this year in District I and District II. It was so nice to be able to have fans this year! Thank you to all of the managers for their efforts. Lewiston High School was a new facility for us and was great with a lot more space. There was a slight delay with the 4A teams having to move gyms due to a leaky roof. We really appreciate Craig Christensen and his crew for stepping up and doing a great job taking care of things. We also appreciate all the teams that were so flexible. The ranking using Max Preps worked out really well however using it for the regular season was a problem. Financials were pretty good and overall, it was a fantastic tournament.

2021 State Swim Meet

Julie Hammons reported on State Swim stating we were thankful that kids got to swim in person this year. We had several restrictions we were given and there were a lot of changes that had to be made. The format was changed and we swam by gender and by classification which created two new sessions per day. Unfortunately, many were not happy with some of the restrictions but overall, the kids got to swim and enjoyed the event. Julie gave a huge thank you to all the workers for their help and also stated we are very much reliant on our relationship with the West YMCA and the Boise Aquatic Center.

2021 State Football Playoffs & Milk Bowl

Ty Jones reported on State Football stating the financials are not yet complete and should be finished up in January. There was an issue at the 5A game when ticket sales were stopped for a couple of hours to clear out some of the 3A fans. A disclaimer was posted however there were still some upset fans. There have been a few ticketing issues with the new online ticketing and we are working on a solution.

2021 State Drama

Mike Federico reported State Drama was held at Centennial High School this year and had close to 500 students participating. Tabroom.com was used again this year and everything went really well. A huge thank you to everyone that helped. It was a fantastic event.

Fall 2020 Concussion Numbers

Conlin Coburn reported on the fall 2021 concussion numbers stating the numbers have gone down. Numbers were compared to 2019, since 2020 was a COVID year. Although there were quite a few more participants this year, the concussion numbers were significantly lower which is a good thing.

Committee Reports

- **State Tournament** – The tournament sites were reviewed and the following changes were made; For boys state basketball Vince Mann is going to take over as the new 5A state tournament manager and Troy Rice is going to be the 4A state tournament manager. Also at state basketball (both boys & girls) there will be a reserved seating section for the semifinals and state championship rounds. There has been a request to move 1A softball to Moscow. That is in the works and information will be sent out once finalized. 4A golf is TBD. Falcon Crest will not be hosting 4A golf this spring. 5A tennis will be at Fort Boise and Fairmont Jr. High.
- **Representation** – will be in the Action Agenda.
- **Student Advisory** – Mike Federico reported there was a meeting in November with some really good discussions. Some of the items they are working on include placing sportsmanship do's and don'ts posters in every gym and focusing on how coaches treat their own players. They also discussed continuing the Battle of the Fans and would like to hold a spring summit in April. This is really a great meeting with a great group of kids.
- **Sportsmanship** – Mike Federico reported they met the 2nd week of November and reviewed the manuals, sportsmanship guidelines and watched videos on sportsmanship. There was a lot of discussion pertaining to officials; on the lack of officials and the inability to retain officials due to fan and coaches' behavior. We put out some guidelines and expectations for our schools that will hopefully be helpful/useful.
- **SMAC** – We are working on wrestling hydration issues and protocols.

8-14-1 **Rental Policy** If the parents of a student move less than fifty miles from their present residence and rent the new residence, the follow information must accompany the Athletic Transfer Form:

1. Letter from parents explaining the move.
2. Letter of support from school filing the request.
3. Letter of support from previous school.
4. Copy of rental agreement.

The IHSAA Executive staff or Board of Directors may approve or deny varsity competition if circumstances warrant.

Parents, students or schools that provide false or misleading information will be subject to Rule 15-6.

- a. A student who transfers to a new school in advance of the parents move will become eligible the day the parents move into the new district, providing all other IHSAA requirements have been met.
- b. The student may remain in the old school until the close of the current semester or until the close of the school year and remain eligible at that school.
- c. The student may transfer to the new school at the time of moving or any time thereafter during the school year or prior to the beginning of the ensuing school year and be eligible upon enrolling in and attending the new school.
- d. If the student does not transfer to the new school within the time periods provided in (a), (b), and (c) above, the student will remain eligible at the original school but is ineligible at the new school unless otherwise approved by the school from which the student transferred and the Eligibility Committee.

2-5 REPRESENTATION

2-5-1 State tournament representation in volleyball, soccer, swimming, football, basketball, wrestling, track, softball and tennis will be determined for a two-year period based on a percentage of schools in that classification. Note: Representation may be altered periodically to reflect the historical representation of each classification.

- a. Representation to state competition will be determined by the percentage of the number of teams from a district or region that qualify for state tournament competition.
- b. State play-in games should be used when the percentage of the representation between districts or regions can be more equitable.
- c. When there are three or more schools within a region or district, representation should be at least 1.5 if possible.
- d. When state play-in games are used, they should be played at neutral sites and between regions or districts of the state that would not cause unrealistic travel requirements. Note: It is considered unrealistic travel if a team cannot travel to a play-in site, compete and return to their own school in one day.

2-5-2 State tournament representation for cross country, golf, speech, debate, drama, cheer and dance will be determined yearly by the total number of team and/or individual finishers at a district/regional qualifying competition.

2-5-3 State tournament brackets for girls' soccer, boys' soccer, volleyball, girls' basketball, boys' basketball and softball will be seeded using MaxPreps regular season rankings.

Softball/Baseball Innings Played Proposal

Written Proposal from St. Maries High School

Things to Consider:

1. Courtesy runner should not count toward a game total
2. Floating players can play up to 10 innings in a sub varsity double header and only be charged 1 game
3. Move to an innings limitation

Rational:

These measures will allow teams to keep their JV programs alive and reduce the strain on small schools trying to field 2 teams.

Current Rule:

Game Limitations

A team or individual is limited to 22 games or 20 games plus one tournament, not to exceed 24 games. If a school loses a scheduled tournament game or a school is unable to attend a tournament due to reasons beyond their control, the school can reschedule lost games. A contestant who exceeds the limitations of regular season participation will become ineligible for district, state or any other additional IHSAA sponsored competition of that sport.

Proposed Rule Change:

Game Limitations for Each Team

A team is limited to 22 games or 20 games plus one tournament, not to exceed 24 games. If a school loses a scheduled tournament game or a school is unable to attend a tournament due to reasons beyond their control, the school can reschedule lost games.

Game Limitations for Individuals

During the regular season, athletes are permitted to play in no more than 154 innings in a 22 game schedule, or 168 in a 24 game schedule. For a game in which the score is tied at the end of seven innings, the extra innings shall be considered as an extension of the seventh inning. A contestant who exceeds the limitations of regular season participation will become ineligible for district, state or any other additional IHSAA sponsored competition of that sport.

Re: [Rule 2-3](#) Classification Petitioning Process; beginning 2024-2025

This is a proposal to change rules governing the classification petitioning process. The [February 2021 proposal](#) helps justify how [Rule 2-3](#) is broken.

Proposed Rule

2-3: The IHSAA Board of Directors shall make the final determination on all classification petitions during their annual September meeting. Classification petitions will be considered for two-year cycles. Schools may petition to move up or down a classification in specific team sports or up a classification in specific individual sports by submitting a classification petition to the IHSAA by September 10 of the grace year. Schools cannot petition to a smaller classification in individual sports.

2-3-1: Cheer, dance, football, boys soccer, girls soccer, volleyball, boys basketball, girls basketball, baseball and softball are considered team sports for the classification petitioning process.

2-3-2: Petitions must include the following to be considered when petitioning down a classification:

- A. Cover letter and letters of support.
- B. Evidence that the varsity, JV, and freshman combined winning percentage was below 25% during the most recent two years of competition against their assigned classification.
- C. Evidence that the varsity, JV, and freshman teams finished in the bottom 33% of their postseason tournaments during the most recent two years of competition.
- D. The IHSAA office will tabulate votes from all superintendents of the classification in which the school wishes to be placed as well as the classification they will be leaving to be used as advisory information.
- E. The IHSAA office will organize team sport committees to review all petitions prior to coming to the IHSAA Board of Directors to be used as advisory information.

2-3-3: Petitions must include the following to be considered when petitioning up a classification:

- A. Cover letter and letters of support.
- B. The IHSAA office will tabulate votes from all superintendents of the classification in which the school wishes to be placed as well as the classification they will be leaving to be used as advisory information.
- C. The IHSAA office will organize team sport committees to review all petitions prior to coming to the IHSAA Board of Directors to be used as advisory information.

The proposed rule change will result in:

1. Protection for smaller schools from losing their state births to a larger school who petitioned down.
2. More competitive games and fewer mismatches/blowouts.
3. Improve struggling schools ability to build their weaker programs.

Current Rule

2-3: Schools may petition to move from one classification to another in all sports/activities or in football only. All petitions will be approved for a two-year classification cycle.

2-3-1: Schools or football programs that do not meet the criteria for moving from one classification to another by using enrollment figures, or will not exceed those limits during the “classification period”, may petition to move up or down in classification by submitting a petition to the IHSAA by September 10 of the grace year.

2-3-2: Schools may use ONE of the following to petition up or down:

- A. Receive a simple majority vote from all voting superintendents of the classification in which the school wishes to be placed as well as the classification they will be leaving.
- B. Complete and submit the Competitive Equity Forms, and additional documentation requested on the forms. This includes but is not limited to the schools’ varsity, JV and freshman team statistics, superintendents’ advisory vote from the classification they wish to join and the classification they will be leaving, and additional information pertinent to the request.
- C. The IHSAA Board of Directors shall make the final determination on all classification petitions.
- D. Football- only petitions must use the guidelines 2-3-2b and all requests will be reviewed by a committee prior to coming to the IHSAA Board of Directors.
