Julie Hammons reported on the financials stating there has not been a lot of change since our December meeting. Overall, year-to-date revenue is down \$170,000 with year-to-date expenses down \$195,000. Dana Facer moved, Jamie Holyoak seconded to approve the December 1, 2020 – December 31, 2020 financial report. Curt-Randall Bayer moved, Jamie Holyoak seconded to approve the IHSAA Board of Directors action via phone, email, fax.

REPORT AGENDA

YEA Update

Julie Hammons reported on the YEA stating we are very fortunate the stock market has been doing well. As of January 19, 2021, the YEA portfolio was just over 4.7 million dollars. Jamborees continue to be down but we are hopeful they will increase for spring.

Dairy West Update

Mike Federico reported the Dairy West meeting is next week. They are rolling out a new video series - Unbottled and Nutritional.

State Drama

Julie Hammons reported State Drama was held virtually this year and schools were charged \$12 per entry to offset costs. The IHSAA lost approximately \$500 on the tournament overall, down from around \$5500 in previous years. There was a tabulation issue with the new software program, Tabroom.com, so the event medalists and the 3A team awards were announced incorrectly at the conclusion of the tournament. The issue was resolved and awards updated before noon the next day. Thank you to our tabroom for their hard work.

NIAAA Conference

Ted Reynolds reported the NIAAA Conference was virtual. Attendance from Idaho was down a bit and a majority of the sessions were on COVID-19. The LTI classes were well attended and although it was a very different conference this year, all the hard work the NIAAA put into this event was very much appreciated.

NFHS Winter Meeting

Ty Jones reported the NFHS winter meeting was held virtually this year. There was still a lot of good information just in a different format.

Contract Renewals

Mike Federico reported we are excited to enter into a five-year agreement with IdahoSports. In addition to providing the audio broadcast streaming for our state tournaments, a pilot program will start where they will video some games as well.

Future Partnerships/Sponsorship

Julie Hammons reported Playfly is a promotional/marketing company that is interested in partnering with the IHSAA. In the partnership, they would take over the management of our current sponsorships and work towards acquiring additional partnerships while promoting the brand of the IHSAA. The contract would be for ten years. Currently Playfly has partnered with seven other state associations and should be submitting a proposal sometime this week.

COVID Survey

Julie Hammons reported on the COVID survey which concentrated on our fall sports. It was very informative showing which schools were affected. Out of the 127 schools that participated 41% did have to quarantine at least one team. Volleyball was the most affected.

NFHS Network

Mike Federico reported we have received many complaints regarding the NFHS network service and the Pixellot cameras not working properly. Mark Koski, the CEO of the NFHS Network has been made aware of the issues. Mark and his team are working to address the issues and has put together some information for trouble shooting along with some contacts that should be helpful. This information will be sent out.

Committee Reports

- State Tournament Committee: Julie Hammons reported the state tournament committee reviewed as much as they could and went over the details, protocols and plans to move forward with the winter activities. A few sites for boys' state basketball had to be changed and we are currently working with the Idaho Center reviewing different options. A final decision was made to have State Speech and Debate be virtual this year. State Wrestling was discussed regarding fans/no fans. Currently State Cheer and Dance is moving forward with an in-person competition with the format still in the works.
- Representation Committee: Representation will be discussed in the Action Agenda.
- Hall of Fame: Julie Hammons reported we are down to 8 finalist which will be submitted to the state selection committee and the inductees will be announced at the April Board Meeting.

Policy Manual

Rule 8-14-1 was reviewed clarifying for spring sports, the season for Idaho was cancelled March 12, 2020 making the end date for the 365 days March 13, 2021. Rule 2-2-2 Classification Proposals were also reviewed. All proposals are due by February 15, 2021.

8-14-1 Bona Fide Move If the parents of a student, or legal guardian in case neither parent is living, make a bona fide move to a new permanent residence in the attendance area of a school to which the student transfers, he/she is immediately eligible provided an *Athletic Transfer Form* is submitted and approved. A permanent residence is the actual physical relocation by the parents or legal guardians of a student at a new residence and termination of all occupancy of the previous residence. The change in residence must be bona fide and used as the address for utilities, registration for voting, registration for driver's licenses, registration for motor vehicles, identification cards, and the attendance zone for other school aged family members for a minimum of 365 days. For the purpose of eligibility, there can be only one residence.

Rental Policy If the parents of a student move less than fifty miles from their present residence and rent the new residence, the follow information must accompany the Athletic Transfer Form:

1. Letter from parents explaining the move.
2. Letter of support from school filing the request.
3. Letter of support from previous school.
4. Copy of rental agreement.

The IHSAA Executive staff or Board of Directors may approve or deny varsity competition if circumstances warrant.

Parents, students or schools that provide false or misleading information will be subject to Rule 15-6.

- a. A student who transfers to a new school in advance of the parents move will become eligible the day the parents move into the new district, providing all other IHSAA requirements have been met.
- b. The student may remain in the old school until the close of the current semester or until the close of the school year and remain eligible at that school.
- c. The student may transfer to the new school at the time of moving or any time thereafter during the school year or prior to the beginning of the ensuing school year and be eligible upon enrolling in and attending the new school.
- d. If the student does not transfer to the new school within the time periods provided in (a), (b), and (c) above, the student will remain eligible at the original school but is ineligible at the new school unless otherwise approved by the school from which the student transferred and the Eligibility Committee.

2-2 Classifications shall be reviewed every two years. Grades 9-12 enrollment numbers are obtained during the enrollment year from the State Department of Education and as outlined in Rule 8-14, 15, 16, 17. Figures are compiled during a one-year period, with a one-year grace period as illustrated below. The average of enrollment figures used in calculating classification shall not be rounded up.

RULE 17 - SEASONS

17-1 **SPORT SEASONS**

Seasons have been established for sports and specific activities sponsored by the IHSAA. A season will commence with the first allowed day of practice and will end with the completion of the state championship in that sport, or other date established by the Board of Directors.

17-1-1 The School Year - The school year is considered to begin August 1 and conclude after the final IHSAA spring sport state championship. Coaching restrictions are in effect during the school year.

17-1-2 Regular Season - Practices are held during the sport season and include items that are not allowed at any other time. The following are usually a part of regular season practice:

- a) Publicized announcement of the start of practice
- b) Restricted attendance according to school boundaries, age, sex, abilities, etc;
- c) Required attendance
- d) Intra squad scrimmages
- e) Teaching team concepts as well as individual techniques and skills through the use of drill, "chalk talks", film sessions etc;
- f) The use of school uniforms and/or protective equipment

17-1-3 Summer Programs Summer programs must be voluntary and must be terminated by the last day of July. The IHSAA supports member schools' involvement in voluntary summer programs. However, the IHSAA believes that students need time off during the summer and strongly recommends that member schools schedule at least ten days of non-student contact during the summer each year.

- a) Coaching restrictions are suspended during the summer (the day after the Spring State Tournaments through July 31st). A high school coach can coach his/her players anytime, anywhere, during this period. During this period a team can scrimmage against another team without violating the out-of-season contest requirements (renting facility etc.). Practice, competition and facility use during the summer, is not covered by IHSAA insurance (liability, catastrophic, concussion etc.).
- b) A high school coach who coaches a team during the summer that advances to a regional or national qualifying event can continue to coach after July 31st until the completion of the tournament/s. IHSAA must approve a written request prior to participation during August.
- c) Students will only be allowed to attend team camps during the summer, not during the school year.
- d) Member schools are prohibited from hosting athletic camps involving students from IHSAA member schools during the month of August. Coaches from member schools are prohibited from working in or hosting athletic camps involving students from IHSAA member schools during the month of August.

17-1-4 Protective Equipment – During the summer, no school-owned uniforms and/or protective equipment may be used without written permission from the IHSAA. With that permission, schools may use their own protective equipment in a camp or clinic for a period of seven days within a ten-day period upon written request from the trustees of the school. Included in the request shall be a statement of recognition that IHSAA sponsored catastrophic insurance provides no coverage for the activity and any and all liabilities rest solely with the school, camp, or clinic. Individual students from a specific school are not required to use the school's protective equipment in the same camp as other team members. Each individual student will only be allowed to use an IHSAA member school's protective equipment by renting or loaning for a period of seven days within a ten-day period.

17-2 **PRE & POST SEASON REGULATIONS**

Only in certain circumstances may school personnel be involved in practice or competition for IHSAA sponsored sports outside the sport season. The regulations listed below are in effect for any program in which students are instructed in the skills and techniques of a specific sport.

17-2-1 Coaching Individual Sports – Certified coaches are defined as any individuals (paid, non-paid, or volunteer as approved by the local school board) who are part of the school's current coaching staff. Individual sports are cross country, swimming, wrestling, golf, tennis, track & field.

- a) Out of season coaching restrictions do not apply to the individual sports.

17-2-2 Coaching Team Sports - Certified coaches are defined as any individuals (paid, non-paid, or volunteer as approved by the local school board) who are part of the school's current coaching staff. Team sports are football, volleyball, soccer, basketball, softball, and baseball. Certified coaches can coach during the school year, outside of their defined season provided the following conditions are met:

- a) Attendance is limited to non-school time.
- b) Participation is strictly voluntary and is open to all high school students that are currently enrolled at the school.
- c) All fees and expenses are provided by the student or his/her parents. No school funds, booster club funds (except those raised by the student and his/her parents for that specific activity/event) or other such funds can be used for entry fees, equipment, uniforms or transportation.
- d) Spectators are admitted without charge.
- e) Award limits and amateur regulations of the IHSAA are followed.
- f) Students cannot be required to attend out-of-season practices, camps or contests.
- g) Sport-specific or athletic classes offered during the regular school day must meet the following criteria:
 - Must be open to all students.
 - Must be a class for credit.
 - If the coach is teaching the class, he/she must be the teacher of record for that class.

17-2-3 Rule of 2 – Coaches can instruct/coach no more than two students at one time by a member of their high school (grades 9- 12) staff of that sport during the school year.

- a) Anytime there are more than two students receiving instruction, it is considered an Open Gym/Field/Facility (Follow the guidelines of Rule 17-2-4)

17-2-4 Open Gym/Field/Facility - Coaches are allowed to coach/instruct any number of students on individual skills and development specific to their sport. Open Gym/Field/Facility does not violate IHSAA rules if the following conditions are met:

- a) Rule of 6 X 6 - Maximum 6 weeks during the school year with a maximum of 6 hours per week.
- b) Sessions do NOT count as required practice time prior to the season.
- c) Scrimmages and/or team competition against anyone that is not enrolled at the school are NOT allowed.
- d) Participants, coaches and/or schools are NOT covered under IHSAA catastrophic insurance plan.
- e) In the sports of baseball and softball, 6 flex hours of throwing instruction is allowed during the two weeks prior to the spring practice start date.
 - The purpose of throwing instruction is to ensure proper mechanics and throwing progression leading into the season for position players, pitchers and catchers.
 - Gloves, balls, protective equipment are allowed. Throwing to bases, ground balls, fly balls, and all other types of practice are prohibited.
- e) Administrative approval of Open Gym/Field/Facility hours and weeks is required from the school Principal or Athletic Director.

17-2-4 Moratoriums – *Waived for 2020-21- The intent of IHSAA Moratoriums is to allow students and teachers/coaches quality time with their families without the pressure of losing a level playing field.

- a) Coaches, athletic trainers, or other school personnel cannot contact students during the 7 days prior to the fall sports season start date.
- c) Winter and spring sport coaches can contact students after the final start date for fall activity practices.
- d) Schools will determine a 3-day, consecutive no contact period over winter break and notify the IHSAA of those dates through their fall School Directory update.

17-5 FOUR-SPORT SEASON

Junior high school leagues are allowed to offer four seasons of play in sports. Athletes are still restricted to one season in each sport.

17-5-1 In the event a ninth-grade athlete wishes to compete on a high school team, in addition to the junior high program, the following conditions must be met:

- a. The athlete must not exceed either the allowed number of a contests or weeks per season.
- b. The athlete must not compete following the completion of the regular high school season.

*A region cannot host two years in a row unless both schools are from that region.

The final decision in setting sites, dates and time for each state championship game will be made by IHSAA Representatives and will be finalized by 10:00 a.m. the Sunday prior to the state championship game.

Selection Criteria:

A. Factors determining the site of a state championship game are:

1. Idaho State University – There may be at least three games, and possibly four, scheduled at Holt Arena. Two games should be scheduled on Friday. The remaining game or games will be scheduled on Thursday or Saturday, with times to be determined by ISU’s football schedule.
2. University of Idaho — There may be a maximum of three games per day scheduled at the Kibbie Dome. If possible, games should be scheduled for Friday afternoon and evening. Game times and dates will be determined by U of I’s football schedule.
3. Boise State University — There may be two games per day played at Dona Larson/ Albertsons Stadium. Game times and dates will be determined by the Boise State football schedule.

B. Other factors determining the site of a state championship game are:

1. Travel - loss of instruction time for the two participating teams.
2. Geographical rotation based upon recent participation of the district from which the teams are participating.
3. A region may not host a state championship game two years in a row unless both teams are from the same region
4. If No. 2 and No. 3 are in conflict with each other, No. 3 will take precedence over No. 2.
5. Availability of lodging and meals for teams, support groups and spectators.
6. Availability of the site to set reasonable game times. No game may be scheduled to start after 9:00 p.m. The team traveling the farthest distance will get first choice of game time.
