REPORT AGENDA

YEA Update

Julie Hammons gave the update on the YEA stating the fund balance exceeded \$5 million for the first time, as of December 31, 2021. Jamborees so far have been doing really well. If you have not scheduled your spring jamborees yet, please do so.

Dairy West Update

Ty Jones reported meeting dates with Dairy West have been solidified.

Officials Update

Ty Jones gave the officials update for Darren Krzesnik who was not in attendance due to a work conflict. Items of concern include wanting an official be on the state tournament representation committee, the lack of officials state wide, which is remains a big concern, and state basketball tournament game fees. Ty stated the state tournament game fees have been revamped for both girls and boys basketball and will also be done for wrestling.

Marketing Update

Zach Hoffman reported there are two additional sponsors for the IHSAA. Inland Northwest Toyota which began January 2022. They will be the official automotive partner and will be the presenting sponsor of Athlete of the Week. Les Schwab Tire Centers is also locked in as a sponsor and will begin July 1, 2022.

2021 State Drama

Julie Hammons reported on the financials for state drama stating they are pretty consistent. Generally, it is about a \$5,000 loss every year but overall, it was a great event with close to 500 students participating.

2021 NIAAA

Ted Reynolds reported the NIAAA Conference was held in Denver, Colorado this year. Idaho sent about 29 AD's which was an all-time high. Overall, it is a great conference and from a professional developmental stand point it is highly recommended. Award winners; Tol Gropp-District Service Award; Tracy Leinen-2020 National Hall of Fame Inductee; Larry Schwenke-2021 National Hall of Fame. Congratulations!

NFHS Winter Meeting

Ty Jones reported on the NFHS winter meeting which was held in San Diego this year. Some main topics included the NFHS Network item and Name, Image, Likeness which are both on the agenda and will be discussed.

IHSAA Superintendent, Board of Control, Principal and Athletic Director Meetings

Ty Jones stated the IHSAA is making a conscious effort to get out and meet with all the different groups; Superintendents, Board of Control, Principals and AD's. It is important to meet with all of these groups especially the Superintendents and Principals, so we can listen/hear and address any concerns or issues and get some good feedback. The goal this year is to make attend about 30 meetings throughout the state and so far, we have been to about 13 meetings. Overall, it has been a fantastic experience.

Committee Reports

- **State Tournament** –
 - Fall Golf – start date changed from August 8th to August 11th.
 - 4A/5A State Track – will not be held at Eagle High School. Once the new location has been finalized, information will be sent out.
 - Speech & Debate State Tournaments – planning on moving forward with in-person events for both; with modifications as needed.
- **Representation** – items are in the Action Agenda.
- **Hall of Fame** – Julie Hammons reported we have a total of 16 applications and are currently collecting votes to determine the finalists. Applications are reviewed/evaluated by two different groups; first the screening committee and then the selection committee. Winners will be announced in April.

Policy Manual

Ty Jones went over Rule 8-18 Undue Influence.

8-18 UNDUE INFLUENCE

- 8-18-1** Definition of Undue Influence: The use of influence by any person connected directly or indirectly with an IHSAA member school, to induce a student to transfer from one member school to the other, or to enter the ninth grade at a member school for athletic competition purposes, whether or not the school presently attended by the student is a member of the IHSAA. (Recruiting)
- 8-18-2** The use of undue influence to secure or retain a student for competitive purposes is prohibited, shall cause the student to be declared ineligible for high school athletics for a period of up to one calendar year, and may jeopardize the standing of the high school in the Association.
- 8-18-3** Evidence of undue influence includes, but is not limited to, personal contact by coaches and sponsors in an attempt to persuade transfer by gifts or money, jobs, supplies, coaching, free transportation, admission to contests, invitation to attend practices and or games, free tuition or any other considerations not accorded to other students similarly situated.
- 8-18-4** Complaints or reports of violations of this rule will be investigated and handled on a case-by-case basis by the District Board of Control. Any school permitting such participation shall, upon satisfactory evidence submitted to the District Board of Control, be suspended from membership in the Association for a term not to exceed one calendar year.

Name, Image, Likeness

A motion was made to approve implementing a Name, Image, Likeness policy as a Final Reading.

An athlete forfeits amateur status in a sport by capitalizing on athletic fame by receiving money, compensation, endorsements or gifts of monetary value in affiliation or connection with the student's school team, school, Section or IHSAA (scholarships to institutions of higher learning are specifically exempted).

1. This provision is not intended to restrict the right of any student to participate in a commercial endorsement provided there is no school team, school, Section or IHSAA affiliation.

An athlete forfeits amateur status in a sport by signing a professional playing contract in that sport.

Re: [Rule 2-3](#) Classification Petitioning Process; beginning 2024-2025

This is a proposal to change rules governing the classification petitioning process. The [February 2021 proposal](#) helps justify how [Rule 2-3](#) is broken.

Proposed Rule

2-3: The IHSAA Board of Directors shall make the final determination on all classification petitions during their annual September meeting. Classification petitions will be considered for two-year cycles. Schools may petition to move up or down a classification in specific team sports or up a classification in specific individual sports by submitting a classification petition to the IHSAA by September 10 of the grace year. **Teams may only petition down in specific team sports.**

2-3-1: Cheer, dance, football, boys soccer, girls soccer, volleyball, boys basketball, girls basketball, baseball and softball are considered team sports for the classification petitioning process.

2-3-2: Petitions must include the following to be considered when petitioning down a classification:

- A. Cover letter and letters of support.
- B. Evidence that the varsity, JV, and freshman combined winning percentage is near or below **25%** during the most recent two years of competition against their assigned classification.
- C. Evidence that the varsity, JV, and freshman teams finished near or below in the bottom **33%** of their postseason tournaments during the most recent two years of competition.
- D. The IHSAA office will tabulate votes from all superintendents of the classification in which the school wishes to be placed as well as the classification they will be leaving. A simple majority of the superintendent votes, one vote per high school, must be obtained to move the petition to the Board for a final decision.
- E. The IHSAA office will organize team sport committees to review all petitions prior to coming to the IHSAA Board of Directors to be used as advisory information.

2-3-3: Petitions must include the following to be considered when petitioning up a classification:

- A. Cover letter and letters of support.
- B. The IHSAA office will tabulate votes from all superintendents of the classification in which the school wishes to be placed as well as the classification they will be leaving. A simple majority of the superintendent votes, one vote per high school, must be obtained to move the petition to the Board for a final decision.
- C. The IHSAA office will organize team sport committees to review all petitions prior to coming to the IHSAA Board of Directors to be used as advisory information.

The proposed rule change will result in:

1. Protection for smaller schools from losing their state births to a larger school who petitioned down.
2. More competitive games and fewer mismatches/blowouts.
3. Improve struggling schools ability to build their weaker programs.

Current Rule

2-3: Schools may petition to move from one classification to another in all sports/activities or in football only. All petitions will be approved for a two-year classification cycle.

2-3-1: Schools or football programs that do not meet the criteria for moving from one classification to another by using enrollment figures, or will not exceed those limits during the “classification period”, may petition to move up or down in classification by submitting a petition to the IHSAA by September 10 of the grace year.

2-3-2: Schools may use ONE of the following to petition up or down:

- A. Receive a simple majority vote from all voting superintendents of the classification in which the school wishes to be placed as well as the classification they will be leaving.
- B. Complete and submit the Competitive Equity Forms, and additional documentation requested on the forms. This includes but is not limited to the schools’ varsity, JV and freshman team statistics, superintendents’ advisory vote from the classification they wish to join and the classification they will be leaving, and additional information pertinent to the request.
- C. The IHSAA Board of Directors shall make the final determination on all classification petitions.
- D. Football- only petitions must use the guidelines 2-3-2b and all requests will be reviewed by a committee prior to coming to the IHSAA Board of Directors.

The final decision in setting sites, dates and time for each state championship game will be made by IHSAA Representatives and will be finalized by 10:00 a.m. the Sunday prior to the state championship game.

Selection Criteria:

A. Factors determining the site of a state championship game are:

1. Idaho State University – There may be at least three games, and possibly four, scheduled at Holt Arena. Two games should be scheduled on Friday. The remaining game or games will be scheduled on Thursday or Saturday, with times to be determined by ISU’s football schedule.
2. University of Idaho — There may be a maximum of three games per day scheduled at the Kibbie Dome. If possible, games should be scheduled for Friday afternoon and evening. Game times and dates will be determined by U of I’s football schedule.
3. Boise State University — There may be two games per day played at Dona Larson/ Albertsons Stadium. Game times and dates will be determined by the Boise State football schedule.

B. Other factors determining the site of a state championship game are:

1. Travel - loss of instruction time for the two participating teams.
2. Geographical rotation based upon recent participation of the district from which the teams are participating.
3. A region may not host a state championship game two years in a row unless both teams are from the same region
4. If No. 2 and No. 3 are in conflict with each other, No. 3 will take precedence over No. 2.
5. Availability of lodging and meals for teams, support groups and spectators.
6. Availability of the site to set reasonable game times. No game may be scheduled to start after 9:00 p.m. The team traveling the farthest distance will get first choice of game time.
