CONSENT AGENDA

The Consent Agenda, which included Minutes from the December, 2008 Board of Directors Meeting, the December 1-31, 2008 Financial Report, IHSAA Board of Directors actions via phone, e-mail and fax, and the Class of 2009 Hall of Fame finalists, of which there are ten, was approved.

REPORT AGENDA

Y.E.A. Update

Dick Curtis reported on the Endowment fund. YEA is at 1.9 million dollars, down from 2.6 million, due to the economic issues. According to fund policies, reimbursements may only be made from the interest generated from the principle. The YEA board will review reimbursement possibilities at their April meeting. Vestments are down a little from last year; jamborees are being reported in a more timely fashion due to the YEA administration being in constant touch with the commissioners from each district.

2008 State Drama

Julie Hammons reported on the 2008 State Drama Tournament held December 5-6 at Century High School in Pocatello. Thirty-eight schools participated in this year's tournament, bringing 453 students. Schools were fined for late drops and not bringing judges, which generated income of \$840. The IHSAA expenses were approximately \$4,000.

NFHS Winter Meeting / Football Rules Meeting

John Billetz reported on the NFHS winter meeting held in Fort Lauderdale, Florida. All states are looking at ways to cut costs and the NFHS will be considering holding meetings at less expensive sites.

The annual football rules meeting will be held January 24 and 25 in Indianapolis.

NFHS Spirit Rules Meeting

Julie Hammons reported on the NFHS Spirit Rules meeting held in Indianapolis. Diane Wolf attended that meeting as the IHSAA representative and is also a member of the Spirit Rules committee. Safety and coaches education are the main focus of the committee. On-line spirit and dance coaches education courses will be available in early 2010.

Diane Wolf was awarded the National Spirit Contributor of the Year. It is the last time this award will be awarded.

NIAAA National Conference

Jay Darrington reported on the NIAAA conference held in San Diego. Activities and workshops were available for professional development to assist athletic directors.

AIG Report

John Billetz reported on the catastrophic insurance policy. Greg Joley from Loomis & Lapann Inc., the catastrophic insurance agency for the IHSAA, reported personally to the IHSAA board at their work meeting on Monday, January 19. AIG's investment side of the business got involved in the sub-prime mortgage industry, but the insurance side of their company is sound. Greg Joley assured the board that Loomis & Lapann's loyalty is to the IHSAA, not to AIG, and will recommend other catastrophic carriers should that become necessary.

State Football at BSU

John Billetz reported on Milk Bowl games held at BSU. Locker room facilities are an issue as well as accommodations for the officials. Opening up the Caven Williams facility to teams could be an option for future games.

SDE Enrollment Figures

John Billetz reported on the enrollment figures collected by the State Department of Education that the IHSAA uses for classification purposes. During the 2010-12 cycle, some schools will be moving up or down in classification, but final determination will be made after the April SDE report. The Classification Committee will meet on March 17. Schools desiring to make classification proposals should review the policy and timelines for submitting those ideas. February 15 is the final date for submitting classification proposals. The SDE figures will be available on the website and at the end of this document.

IHSAA Contracts / Agreements

John Billetz reported on a document in which all IHSAA contracts and agreements are listed. Formal starting and ending dates for webcasting, IHSAA photographer, merchandising and trophies/medals have been established and itemized.

UDI Report

John Billetz reported on a meeting that he and Julie Hammons attended with Deanna Sessions. Concerns and recommendations were reviewed by both sides. The Interscholastic Star scholarship program is greatly supported by the UDI.

SDE Report

Nick Smith, IHSAA representative from the State Department of Education, reported on economic issues at the SDE. SDE will be cut back \$80 million in the state budget. Comments and questions from outside the SDE have been forwarded to him suggesting cutbacks in athletics and activities.

CAT Committee

Dave Neumann reported on suggestions from the CAT committee. Not adding new programs for three years is already on the Action Agenda of the current meeting. Reducing the number of contests by ten percent has been suggested.

Volleyball Officials

Permitting the use of one volleyball official for sub-varsity meets and tournaments was approved as a Final Reading.

Schools of Excellence

Adding finishes from non-sport activities (speech, debate, drama, cheer, dance and music) and the State Baseball Tournament to the Schools of Excellence Program was approved as a Final Reading.

Spalding Football

Adoption of the Spalding J5V Advanced Composite and Advanced Leather Football for all state playoff games was denied. Returning Membership dues beginning with the 2009-10 fiscal year to \$250 was approved as a First Reading .

Rule 17-3-1

Revising IHSA Rule 17-3-1, which deals with schools where the ninth grade is in the junior high, was approved as a Final Reading. The current rule reads:

In the event a ninth grade athlete wishes to compete on a high school team, in addition to the junior high program, the following conditions must be met:

- a. The athlete must not have started practice prior to the high school starting date.
- b. The athlete must not compete before the allowable date prescribed for high school competitors.
- c. The athlete must not exceed either the allowed number of contests or weeks per season.
- d. The athlete must not compete following the completion of the regular high school season.

The revised rule reads:

In the event a ninth grade athlete wishes to compete on a high school team, in addition to the junior high program, the following conditions must be met:

- a. The athlete must not exceed either the allowed number of contests or weeks per season.
- b. The athlete must not compete following the completion of the regular high school season.

Donation

Making a one time donation of \$1,000 (amended from \$1,500) to the National Executive Directors Council Conference in Coeur d'Alene was approved as a Final Reading.

Soccer Ball

Adopting the Spalding Soccer ball for all state play-in and tournament games was denied.

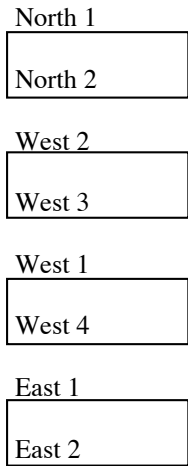
2009 Football

Rule 4-3-6

Adding the following language to Rule 4-3-6 was approved as a First Reading:

“Any ejection that is a result of physical contact *or excessive verbal abuse* by a player/coach on a game official will be referred to the local District Board of Control for review to determine if any additional reprimand or suspension is warranted.”

Sport Addition Moratorium

A two year moratorium on adding new sports or activities was approved as a First Reading.

3A / 2A Golf

Changing the 2A and 3A State Golf Tournament format to allow any individual who qualifies for the state tournament (beginning with the 2009 tournament) to play both days was approved as a Final Reading.

Classification Request

A request from Potlatch High School to waive Rules 2-3 and 2-3-1, allowing them to petition the 1A DI superintendents to move down to that classification mid-cycle, beginning with the 2009-10 year, was approved. Vote of the superintendents by the IHSAA will be completed before the April meeting.

Tenth Football Game

A request from Minico High School to play a tenth football game during zero week against Bishop Kelly High School was approved as a Final Reading.

Eligibility for Student A was approved.

DISCUSSION AGENDA

1. Provisions for para-Olympic athletes participating in state track were discussed. A model from the Washington Association was presented. Dave Mills from Boise High School left a DVD of USOC para-Olympic athletes for the Board to review. The Washington model, if used, would need revising if para-Olympic athletes are to be included in the Idaho State Track Meet.
The process of adopting provisions for par-Olympic athletes to participate and contribute to team scoring at the State Track Meet was moved to the Action Agenda of the April meeting.
2. A request from Tom Farley asking for a financial donation of \$500 to the Idaho Academic Decathlon was discussed.
No action was taken.
3. Reducing the number of regular season contests was discussed. The CAT committee has recommended a ten percent reduction in all regular season contests. The possibility of reducing the number of dates rather than the number of contests was presented. Eliminating IHSAA play-in games was suggested.
A ten percent reduction in all regular season contests was moved to the Action Agenda of the April meeting as a First Reading. Member schools are strongly encouraged to submit opinions and suggestions on this issue.
4. Outside Competition Rule 8-11 was discussed.
8-11-1 A student who competes in organized non-school contests or events after the starting date of the high school season in that sport, except as provided in Rule 12, is ineligible for the school team for the remainder of that sport season. Revising the rule to not terminate a participant's eligibility for the rest of the season is recommended. A suggested revision reads:
A student who competes in organized non-school contests or events after the starting date of the high school season in that sport, except as provided in Rule 12 is ineligible for the next regularly scheduled contest plus an additional regularly scheduled contest per infraction, with a referral to the District Board of Control for a fine of no less than \$300. Contests may not be scheduled to create eligibility. Revision of Rule 8-11 was moved to the Action Agenda of the April meeting as a First Reading.
5. Transfer rules and how they relate to club sports was discussed. The IHSAA waiver transfer Rule 8-14-11 as it now reads makes transferring students ineligible if they participated in a club sport that is also an IHSAA sport.

This item will remain on the Discussion Agenda of the April meeting with a suggested wording change to be brought at that time.

6. IHSAA control of 5A/4A quarter-final football games was reviewed.
No action was taken.
7. The use of 3-man crews for officiating basketball was discussed.
No action was taken.
8. A letter from Jackpot High School requesting regular membership in the IHSAA for football only was discussed. The District IV Board of Control will be notified as well as the Nevada Association.
9. Charging separate activity fees for boys' and girls' cross country, golf and tennis was reviewed. Currently the \$25 fee includes both genders in these sports.
Charging participation fees for boys' and girls' in cross country, golf and tennis was moved to the Action Agenda of the April meeting.
