John Billetz reported on a revision of the Waiver of Transfer eligibility form that reflects involvement in club sports. The change is in Section C, #2 and reads as follows:

- 2. **Initial** all activities in which the student competed, tried out for, or participated on any **organized club (this includes programs that are outside of school), school or otherwise scheduled team** (Freshman, J.V., Varsity) during the 12 months preceding the date of transfer.

IHSAA Photographer

Ryan Thomas Photography was approved as the official IHSAA photographer from August 1, 2009 through July 31, 2012 as a Final Reading.

IHSAA Activity Fees

Charging separate activity fees for girls’ and boys’ in cross country, golf and tennis was approved as a Final Reading.

IHSAA Membership

Jackpot High School’s request to become a member of the IHSAA in football was approved as a Final Reading.

2009 5A Football

Returning, for one (1) year only, to a regional format during the 2009 5A football playoffs was approved as a Final Reading. This includes returning to the historical revenue split of the tenth game.

Jay Darrington noted that there will not be a football scheduling meeting at the September board meeting in Moscow. It will be held at the IHSAA office in October.

Rule 8-11

Revising IHSAA Rule 8-11 Outside Competition was approved as a Final Reading.

The rule now reads (and is retro-active to those students who have already violated the rule):

8-11 OUTSIDE COMPETITION

8-11-1 Outside competition is defined as a student who competes in organized, non-school contests or events after the starting date of the high school season in that sport, except as provided in Rule 12.

8-11-2 Violation of this rule will result in the following:

- a. The student will be ineligible for the next regularly scheduled contest plus an additional regularly scheduled contest per infraction. Regularly scheduled contests include: season contest, district, and state.
- b. Infractions will be reported to the District Board of Control, who may levy additional fines or penalties.

8-11-3 A second violation during the four years of eligibility by that student of the outside competition rule will result in the following:

- a. The student will be ineligible for the school team for the remainder of that sports season.
- b. Additional assessments may be possible.

8-11-4 Contests may not be scheduled to create eligibility.

Wrestling Minimum Certified Weight Date

Eliminating February 1 as the date a wrestler is required to reach his/her minimum certified weight class was approved as a Final Reading.

Weight Classifications:

103 112 119 125 130 135 140 145 152 160 171 189 215 285

To be eligible for district and state competition, each wrestler must weigh-in at scratch weight, then compete at scratch weight, or up one weight above scratch weight, on three of the 16 regular season dates. The coach must be able to provide verification that any wrestler has made the three required weigh-ins before the seeding meeting. One may only count weigh-ins conducted at meets in which your school participates.

Track Wheel Chair Athletes

The criteria for wheel chair track athletes to score individual/team points at local, district, and state track meets, starting with the 2010 track season was approved as a Final Reading.

1. Eligibility: All wheelchair athletes must meet the rules established by the IHSAA and individual school districts.
2. Wheelchair athletes may only compete for individual and team honors in the school classification and gender in which his/her school competes.
3. No wheelchair athlete shall be permitted to enter more than four individual wheelchair events.

Wheelchair Events: 100 Meters, 200 Meters, 400 Meters, 800 Meters, 1600 Meters, 3200 Meters, Shot Put, Discus Throw

Equipment:

1. (Track) A wheelchair athlete shall compete in track events in manually operated wheelchair that meets the following specifications:
 - a. Shall have a minimum of three wheels.
 - b. The diameter of the two largest wheels (including inflated tire) shall not exceed 28 inches. Other wheel/s diameters shall not exceed 20 inches (including the inflated tire).
 - c. Only one push rim shall be attached to each large wheel.
 - d. The chair's seat, including the cushion, shall not exceed 25 inches in height.
2. (Field) An athlete may throw from his/her wheelchair or a throwing frame. Both must comply with the following standards:
 - a. The throwing frame sitting surface including the cushion must not exceed 75 cm. in height.
 - b. If the frame has a holding bar, it must be fixed (no articulating joints).
 - c. No part of the throwing frame or wheelchair may be outside the circumference of the circle.
 - d. The size of the discus and shot for wheelchair participants shall be the same as for all other male and female participants.

Scoring Criteria (Regular Season, District & State Meets)

1. At least two wheelchair athletes from different schools must compete against one another in an event for team points to be awarded. If only one athlete competes in an event it will be as an exhibition only.
2. Events may be combined by gender and classification but scoring and awards will be separated out.
3. In the event that at least two wheelchair athletes from different schools compete against one another, a team trophy (if the meet provides trophies) for the combined scores of the wheelchair athlete/s and the able bodied athletes from the same school shall be awarded. Individual medals 1st through 6th place and two team trophies may be awarded.
4. Awarding of points:

Eight or more athletes:	10-8-7-6-5-4-3-2-1
Seven athletes:	8-6-5-4-3-2-1
Six athletes:	6-5-4-3-2-1
Five athletes:	5-4-3-2-1
Four athletes:	4-3-2-1
Three athletes:	3-2-1
Two athletes:	2-1
One athlete:	Exhibition only

Qualifying for the IHSAA State Track Meet:

1. All wheelchair athletes must qualify to the IHSAA State Track Meet through the district meet.
2. Wheelchair athletes must meet or surpass the minimum standard in their particular event/s. If a competitor fails to meet the required standard in an event at the district meet, he/she will not be allowed to compete in that event at the IHSAA State Track Meet.

8-9-4 Other International Students

An international student who is not under the auspices of, and placed by, a CSIET listed exchange program must meet the following requirements in order to be considered for interscholastic athletics eligibility:

- a. The student must possess a current F-1 visa, issued by the U.S. Immigration and Naturalization Service.
- b. The student must provide to the principal of the school he/she attends an official untranslated transcript and a transcript that is translated into English, by an acceptable agent or agency, which indicates work taken in all grades in which the student was enrolled.
- c. The international student must pay tuition to the high school he/she attends as prescribed in Section 625 of U.S. Public Law 104-208.
- d. No member of the school's coaching staff, paid or voluntary, shall serve as the resident family for the student.
- e. The international student must comply with all eligibility requirements set forth by the state high school association of which the school he/she attends is a member.
- f. Non-compliance with one or more of the foregoing provisions shall render the international student ineligible for interscholastic athletics at any high school which is a member of any NFHS member state high school association.

NEW

8-9-4 Other International Students

An international student will be ineligible for varsity interscholastic extra curricular activities for one year from the date of initial enrollment and attendance in the new school. International students who *are* not under the auspices of, and placed by, a CSIET listed exchange program must meet the following requirements in order to be considered for interscholastic athletics eligibility:

- a. *Must file an Eligibility Regulation Waiver with the IHSAA Office.*
- b. The student must possess a current F-1 visa, issued by the U.S. Immigration and Naturalization Service.
- c. The student must provide to the principal of the school he/she attends an official untranslated transcript and a transcript that is translated into English, by an acceptable agent or agency, which indicates work taken in all grades in which the student was enrolled.
- d. The international student must pay tuition to the high school he/she attends as prescribed in Section 625 of U.S. Public Law 104-208.
- e. No member of the school's coaching staff, paid or voluntary, shall serve as the resident family for the student.
- f. The international student must comply with all eligibility requirements set forth by the state high school association of which the school he/she attends is a member.
- g. Non-compliance with one or more of the foregoing provisions shall render the international student ineligible for interscholastic athletics at any high school that is a member of any NFHS member state high school association.

Official of the Year

Roger Kunz was approved as the recipient of the first Official of the Year award at the 2009 Hall of Fame banquet.

IHSAA Personnel

John Billetz's contract was extended for two years with a two percent salary increase for 2009-10 and two more vacation days.

Julie Hammons' contract was extended for two years with a two percent salary increase for 2009-10. The IHSAA staff salaries were increased by two percent for 2009-10.

Student Eligibility

Eligibility for student A was approved.

Eligibility for student B was denied.

Eligibility for student C was denied.

DISCUSSION AGENDA

1. Reducing the number of regular season contests by ten percent was discussed. Some small, remote schools are concerned that they will be cut more than that amount by other schools dropping them due to travel costs if this is passed. Letters from two remote school superintendents were received in opposition to the reduction. District I is opposed to the IHSAA making those cuts; District II is somewhat in favor of making reductions, but no across-the-board cuts; District III was split, but primarily in favor of allowing the schools to make their own cuts; District IV schools would prefer to make their own reductions; District V was in favor of reductions, but would like some direction from the IHSAA; Dist. VI is in favor of local control.
Ron Bolinger (through Barbara Taylor) requested that the board look at the language requiring a school administrator or designee to attend all IHSAA games.
No action was taken.
2. Requests from the State Tennis Coaches were discussed. They are requesting that the Rule of Two be eliminated for tennis and that a committee be formed to seed the 5A bracket for the state tournament, if seeding is possible.
Drawing the tennis brackets as other sports are drawn by the IHSAA may be a possibility.
The format of the State Tennis Tournament was moved to the Action Agenda of the August meeting.
No action was taken on eliminating the rule-of-two for tennis.
3. The site of the September board meeting was discussed. The meeting will be held September 28-29 in Moscow at the Best Western University Inn. The location was changed from Lewiston to Moscow for financial reasons. There will be no statewide football scheduling meeting prior to this meeting.
4. Softball / Baseball game limitations were reviewed. The limitations are recommended to be changed in 2011 to twenty games plus one tournament.
This item was moved to the Action Agenda of the August meeting.
5. Rule 8-16 and the definition of a Non Traditional Student was reviewed. The rule would clarify the definition of a Non Traditional Student to be a home school or private school student, not a public charter school student.
Modification of Rule 8-16 to remove public charter school students from the definition of a Non Traditional Student was moved to the Action Agenda of the August meeting.
