CONSENT AGENDA

The Consent Agenda, which included Minutes from the August 10, 2011 Board of Directors Meeting correcting the NFHS 220 pound weight class, the August 1-September 22, 2011 Financial Report, and IHSAA Board of Directors Action via phone, e-mail and fax, was approved.

REPORT AGENDA

Y.E.A. Update

The YEA Board of Directors will add debate and wrestling to the list of reimbursable activities for the 2011-12 year. This item will be approved at their December board meeting. YEA is looking for opportunities to reimburse schools that are fully vested and to encourage schools that are not participating in the Foundation to do so.

Annual Meeting

John Billetz reported on the Annual Meeting that was held August 10. Since there were no issues on which to be voted by member schools, attendance was minimal. Plaques were awarded to the winners of the 2010-11 Schools of Excellence program.

Hall of Fame Banquet

Julie Hammons gave the financial report of the 2011 Hall of Fame banquet.

Section 7/8 Conference

John Billetz reported on the Section 7-8 meeting that was held in Alaska. Four states are dealing with Title IX issues. The 2012 meeting will be in Montana.

Administrative Workshops

John Billetz reported on the Administrative Meetings that were held in all activity districts.

Online rules clinics will be held for wrestling, basketball, and speech arts. All online clinic times are Mountain Time.

Districts Presidents & Secretaries Meeting

John Billetz reported on the meeting held in the IHSAA attended by the presidents and secretaries of the District Boards of Control. New people in those positions are: District I Secretary Larry Schwenke; District IV President Scott Rogers; District V President Gary Brogan; District VI President Chad Williams, Secretary Glenn Romney.

Host Hotels for State Tournaments

John Billetz reviewed the 2011-12 host hotels for IHSAA state tournaments.

Fall State Tournaments

The 2011 State Soccer tournament will be held in the Treasure Valley. Times are different from previous tournaments in that area. All 4A and 5A championship games for will be held in stadiums in the evening.

The State Cross Country tournament will be held at Eagle Island State Park and chip timed. There will be a \$5 parking fee. The park manager has agreed to honor UDI cards, but not IHSAA cards. IHSAA will purchase parking tickets for coaches who have purchased an IHSAA card. Busses will be free and State Park passes will be honored.

State Dance and Cheer will be a two-day event in March. Both days will be held at the Idaho Center, with the 3A's/2A's competing on Friday and the 5A's/4A's on Saturday.

The State Volleyball Tournament is to be held in October in Districts I and II. This tournament will return to a session format, with the facility being cleared after each session. Times were changed for the semi final matches.

NFHS/Idaho 2010-11 Participation Survey

John Billetz reviewed the 2010-11 participation survey published by the NFHS. (See page 8.)

Office of Civil Rights – State Title IX Workshops

John Billetz reported on the up-coming Title IX Workshops to be held around the state. Only one school district is known to have received an official investigation notice from the OCR. Schools need to let the IHSAA know how many representatives from their school will be attending the workshop. The State Department of Education is providing some funding for travel expenses.

Online Ticketing

Julie Hammons reported on the piloting of online ticket sales for fall tournaments. Online ticketing will be available for soccer, volleyball, and the championship round only for football. EZticketlive is the vendor for the tickets. There is a \$1 per ticket convenience fee, of which the IHSAA receives none. Schools will be e-mailed the link for online ticketing when their school qualifies for a state tournament.

2012 State Track

John Billetz reported on the site issue for 2012 State Track. BSU is unable to host that tournament due to construction of their new varsity center. As soon as sites have been determined, member schools will be notified. Up to five sites may be utilized. Schools may be asked to bring one volunteer each to assist with tournament workers.

ACTION AGENDA

2012-14 Classification Numbers

Using SDE Average Daily Attendance numbers for the first Friday of November 2010 and March 2011 with 5% added to the average for absenteeism to classify member schools for the 2012-2013, 2013-2014 classification cycle as a Final Reading. ADA numbers will only be used for the 2012-14 cycle. (See page 9.)

Schools petitioning up from 4A to 5A is Highland HS, Pocatello (all superintendents approved their request); Oakley: from 1A DI to 2A; Greenleaf Friends, Compass Honors, Genesee from 1A DII to 1A DI; Deary and Clark Fork from 1A DI to 1A DII; Kamiah (tentatively) from 2A to 1A DI; St Maries (tentatively) from 2A to 3A. The IHSAA will ask the superintendents of the classifications being "left" for their approval as well.

State Tennis

The procedure for substitution of alternate players at the State Tennis Tournament was approved as a Final Reading.

In the event that a qualifier is unable to participate in the state tournament due to circumstances beyond the player's control, the following guidelines will be followed when substituting the district alternate:

1. 4A and 3A Tournaments:
 - a. If district champion or runner-up drops:
 1. Remove player and advance remaining district qualifiers one position.
 2. Place resulting district #1 and #2 according to draw priorities.
 3. Re-draw remaining players in the bracket.
 - b. If district #3 or lower (#4, #5, #6...) drops:
 1. The district alternate will be directly substituted into the draw.
 2. The alternate will take the same place in the draw as the player who became unable to play. The bracket will not be re-drawn.
 - c. If one member of a doubles team is unable to participate, an alternate from that same school will be allowed to substitute on the doubles team, regardless of the district tournament results. The bracket will not be re-drawn.
 - d. If both members of a doubles team are unable to participate, procedures a. and b. (above) will be followed.
2. 5A Tournament:
 - a. If seeded player drops:
 1. Take the 8 seeds, and remove student who is unable to play.
 2. Move the other seeds up one spot and pull up the #9 player into the #8 seed spot.
 3. Place district alternate into the group that will be drawn for spots #9-#16.
 4. Re-draw the bracket.
 - b. If non-seeded player drops:
 1. The district alternate will be directly substituted into the draw.
 2. The alternate will take the same place in the draw as the player who became unable to play. The bracket will not be re-drawn.
 - c. If one member of a doubles team is unable to participate, an alternate from that same school will be allowed to substitute on the doubles team, regardless of the district tournament results. The bracket will not be re-drawn.
 - d. If both members of a doubles team are unable to participate, procedures a. and b. (above) will be followed.

Deadline for drops is the Wednesday prior to the tournament at noon. Any drops reported after the deadline will result in a first-round bye and no district alternates will be added.

The tennis representation to the 2012 State Tennis Tournament was approved as a Final Reading.

Rule 15-3: Violations at State Tournaments

A revision to the guidelines dealing with rule violations/eligibility issues after the start of a state tournament, adding cheer and dance, was approved as a FINAL Reading.

15-3 Violations at State Tournaments The IHSAA shall have the right to initiate and conduct an investigation into reported violations of its By-Laws or Rules and Regulations by a member school, its employees, coaches, officials, students or any other party subject to the Rules and Regulations at playoffs and state tournament events.

ADD:

- a. If the violation comes to the attention of tournament management after the tournament has begun, but before the conclusion of the tournament, the following guidelines shall be used:
 1. For individual sports/activities (i.e., cross country, wrestling, tennis, golf, track, speech arts) the individual (s) shall be deemed ineligible for the remainder of the tournament. Any team points earned y ineligible participant(s) shall be vacated, and brackets (if applicable) will move forward with a bye. No games/contests will be replayed.
 2. For team sports/activities (i.e., soccer, football, volleyball, basketball, softball, cheer/dance), the team will forfeit the last game played, and the team will be able to continue without the ineligible player(s). The ineligible player(s) shall be removed from further competition in the tournament. No games/contest will be replayed. No team or individual awards shall be given to the violating team.

Academic Champions

Moving the Academic State Champions fall reporting deadline to October 10th was approved as a Final Reading.

Section 7: Review & Audit to Article VIII

The addition of Section 7: Review & Audit to Article VIII of the IHSAA By-Laws, "A Financial Review will be conducted for three years with a full audit on the fourth year" was approved as a Final Reading.

NFHS Wrestling Weight Classes

Adopting the new NFHS wrestling weight classes beginning with the 2011-12 season and piloting a 98 lb. weigh class for the 2011-12 season was approved as a Final Reading. The new weight classes are: (98), 106, 113, 120, 126, 132, 138, 145, 152, 160, 170, 182, 195, 220, 285.

Officials

Revising IHSAA Rule 10-3-3 Officials Testing was approved as a Final Reading.

Part II tests will be administered online through the NFHS during a 14-day window. Tests will be available from 12:01 A.M. on the first test date to 11:59 P.M. on the final test date. Test dates are 14 consecutive days.

- a. Tests may be taken OPEN BOOK.
- b. Tests be may be retaken up to 99 times during the 14 day test period.

Revising IHSAA Rule 10-2-2 Officials Registration Procedure was approved as a Final Reading.

- a. District commissioners/interpreters will forward an IHSAA email in June of each year to all previously registered officials in their district containing a registration form and dates/sites of the State Rules Clinics. This information is also posted on the IHSAA website, idhsaa.org.
- b. Varsity officials must file registration on or before the deadline set by the Board of Directors. People filing registration forms after these dates will be classified **Non varsity**.

Revising IHSAA Rule 10-1-6 Officials Assignments was approved as a Final Reading.

Officials assigned to play-in games involving the sports of volleyball, football, soccer, basketball, and softball will be selected from the host district.

In the sports of volleyball and basketball if one of the schools is from the host district, the officials should be selected from the activity districts involved in the play-in game. One official from each participating district would be selected.

Requesting Neutral Officials By classification in football, an activity district may request that officials selected to officiate play-in games be assigned from a neutral district that is located closest to the site of the play-off game. Such requests must be submitted by the district secretary in writing to the IHSAA prior to October 1. Example: Dist. V secretary requests all 5A football play-in games involving Dist. IV to use officials from a neutral district. If the game is played in Dist. IV, Dist. III officials would be used. If the game is played in Dist. V, Dist. VI officials would be used.

If circumstances exist where officials are not available from a neutral district, the officials will be assigned under the IHSAA standard policy for assigning officials to play-off games.

By-Laws / Contingency Fund

Adding the contingency reserve fund policy to Section 8, Article VIII of the By-Laws was approved as a Final Reading.

Contingency Reserve Fund The IHSAA Board of Directors will designate \$500,000 of the Association's unrestricted net assets for a contingency reserve fund. The net assets designated for the contingency reserve fund may only be used to cover the Association's operating expenses during a period when the Association's revenue is not sufficient to cover its expenses as determined by the Association's Board of Directors.

Rule 17-2-6: Protective Equipment

Revising Rule 17-2-6 Protective Equipment, returning to seven days and eliminate the two days of helmets and shoulder pads, was approved as a First Reading.

17-2-6 Protective Equipment No school-owned uniforms and/or protective equipment may be used without written permission from the IHSAA. With that permission, schools may use their own protective equipment in a camp or clinic for a period of **seven (7) days** upon written request from the trustees of the school. Included in the request shall be a statement of recognition that IHSAA sponsored catastrophic insurance provides no coverage for the activity and any and all liabilities rest solely with the school, camp, or clinic.

Individual students from a specific school are not required to use the school's protective equipment in the same camp as other team members. Each individual student will only be allowed to use an IHSAA member school's protective equipment by renting or loaning for a period of **seven (7) consecutive days**.

Calendars

Moving the 2012-2013 Calendar from Tentative to Approved changing the 2013 January meeting to Tuesday-Wednesday with other modifications as needed was approved as a First Reading.

Moving the 2013-2014 Calendar from Suggested to Tentative with modifications as needed was approved as a First Reading.

Moving the 2014-2015, 2015-2016 Suggested Calendars adjusting spring tournament dates in 2016, April 21-23 for All State Music with other modifications as needed was approved as a First Reading.

Cheer

Adding a Pom Division to cheer was approved as a First Reading.

Pom: Time: 1:00 max. Routine should include a variety of motions, dance, and transitions while using poms.

Participants must use poms throughout 80% or more of the routine. Music is required for the entire routine. Permitted: jumps, kicks, leaps, turns, and non-airborne tumbling. Not Permitted: airborne tumbling, stunts, pyramids, tosses, chants, megaphones, signs, and banners.

DISCUSSION AGENDA

1. Participation of students from non member boarding schools was discussed. The suggested rule would be: “Boarding school students will be ineligible for varsity interscholastic activities for one year from the date of enrollment in the boarding school facility.”

Adoption of this rule was moved to the Action Agenda of the December meeting.

2. Co-ops in music programs was discussed. An orchestra made up of participants from various schools wants to participate in a district festival. The IHSAA board agreed that if the group is named to differentiate the group from a particular school, they may participate in the district festival and receive a “ranking” or “rating”. No awards are given in this type of festival. Gary Gemberling will ask the IMEA to develop guidelines for these types of groups, where students are participating in multiple groups.

This item was moved to the Action Agenda of the December meeting as a Final Reading with criteria coming from IMEA for guidelines.

3. Designating a period of time as a “dead period” with no camps, no weight room, no open gym, no coach contact, no passing leagues, was discussed.

Approval of a ten day dead period (including weekends) was moved to the Action Agenda of the December meeting.
