### **RESOLUTIONS DUE FEBRUARY 15, 2011**

Please be reminded that IHSAA Resolutions to be voted on at the Annual Meeting of the Idaho High School Activities Association must be submitted in writing to the IHSAA office by February 15, 2011. Resolutions will be submitted to the legislative body of the IHSAA at its Annual Meeting on August 3, 2011.

## **STARTING DATE FOR 2011 FALL AND WINTER SPORTS**

**Football:** Schools playing the early game in football may begin football practice on Monday, August 8 after submitting a written waiver request to the IHSAA. All other member schools may begin football practice on August 12. Helmets may be worn on the first day. Each player must have at least two days of practice without any pads. Shoulder pads may be worn on the third day and full pads on the fifth day.

**Soccer:** Practice may begin on August 8; the first game date is August 19.

**Volleyball, Cross Country:** Practice may begin on August 12.

**Girls Basketball:** Practice may begin on October 31; the first game date is November 11.

**Boys Basketball:** Practice may begin on November 11; the first game date is November 26.

**Wrestling:** Practice may begin on November 14; the first match date is December 6. A full ten days of practice is required in the sport of wrestling. Wrestlers must pass the hydration test and be weight certified prior to starting practice.

In all sports, the day of the first scheduled contest shall not be counted as one of the required ten practice days.

## **NATIONAL GIRLS & WOMEN IN SPORTS DAY CELEBRATES 25 YEARS!**

The 25th annual celebration of National Girls and Women in Sports Day was February 2, 2011. NAGWS is one of five Coalition members who plan the Washington, DC-based celebration on Capitol Hill and prepare the materials and products available for you to host an event in your school or community.

On February 2, 2011, thousands of sports educators, coaches, athletic directors, recreation directors, association members, sponsors, students, and parents across the country showed their support of the Day and of this year's theme, "Play, Believe, Achieve."

Athletes like Martina Navratilova, Candace Parker or Jessica Mendoza who played or are still playing are making a difference, overcoming difficult circumstances, breaking records and making things possible.

Despite the stunning advances made in the 38 years since Title IX was enacted, high school girls still receive 1.3 million fewer participation opportunities than do boys, and evidence suggests that the money spent on girls' sports programs lags significantly behind the money spent on boys' programs.

NGWSD is celebrated in all 50 states with community-based events, award ceremonies, and activities honoring the achievements and encouraging participation of girls and women in sports.

NGWSD began in 1987 as a day to remember Olympic volleyball player [Flo Hyman](#) for her athletic achievements and her work to assure equality for women's sports. Hyman died of Marfan's Syndrome in 1986 while competing in a volleyball tournament in Japan. Since that time, NGWSD has evolved into a day to acknowledge the past and recognize current sports achievements, the positive influence of sports participation, and the continuing struggle for equality and access for women in sports.
