IHSAA SELECTS FIVE INTERSCHOLASTIC STARS

Five Idaho high school juniors have been named as the 2010 recipients of the Interscholastic Star Student Recognition Scholarships, which are awarded, annually by the Idaho High School Activities Association and its official sponsor, The United Dairymen of Idaho.

Tori Marker, Highland (Craigmont) High School, Megan DeFord, Grangeville High School, Nayar Barron, Weiser High School, Adrian Quiroz, Burley High School, and Adam Ingersoll, Centennial High School were selected from a field seventy-seven outstanding students who were nominated by their school principals. Twenty-five semifinalists and ten finalists were selected in a two-step screening process. Other finalists were Blair Peck, Carey High School, Bethany Blaisdell, Malad High School, Steven Elsbury, Orofino High School, Jordan Maxwell, Moscow High School, and Taylor Stewart, Coeur d'Alene High School.

Nominees for the scholarships are exemplary students who participate in IHSAA-sponsored sports and activities. Each application includes an essay, recommendations from school administrators, description of athletic and activity participation, and service to school and community.

Interscholastic Stars will receive a \$1000 scholarship to the college of his/her choice, and will be recognized at the IHSAA Hall of Fame banquet in Boise on August 4. The United Dairymen of Idaho will also contribute \$1000 to the recipients' schools and \$500 to the finalists' schools.

Tori Marker, daughter of John and Debbie Marker, participates in volleyball, basketball, and softball at Highland (Craigmont) High School. She is also active in cheerleading, band, student government, National Honor Society, FFA, FCCLA and 4-H.

Megan DeFord, daughter of Carl and Lori DeFord, participates in volleyball, basketball, track and band at Grangeville High School. Other activities include student government, National Honor Society, 4-H and FFA.

Nayar Barron, son of Victor Barron and Maria Gonzalez, participates in cross country, basketball, baseball, speech, debate and band at Weiser High School. Nayar is also a member of Key Club, participates in National Honor Society and attended the National Young Leaders conference.

Adrian Quiroz, son of Sylvester and Maria Quiroz, participates in football, wrestling, and band at Burley High School. He is the student body vice-president of his school and is also involved in FFA and CYO (Catholic Youth Organization).

Adam Ingersoll, son of Matthew and Marianne Ingersoll, participates football, basketball, track and orchestra at Centennial High School. He is also active in a variety of leadership groups including National Honor Society and Boy Scouts of America.

2009-2010 SCHOOLS OF EXCELLENCE

The Idaho High School Activities Association has announced the 2009-2010 winners of the "Schools of Excellence" initiative, a year-long, voluntary program in which schools earn points based on their student-athletes' performance in the classroom, at the athletic venue, in activities' competitions and in the area of citizenship and sportsmanship. The participating schools in each classification with the best overall programs will be recognized at the IHSAA Annual Meeting, August 4. These schools will be presented with a plaque, sponsored by the 4th District Coaches Association.

Exemplary Achievement Status is awarded to schools of each classification that finish second and third in the final point compilation. 2009-10 Exemplary Achievement high schools are: 5A-Centennial, Rocky Mountain; 4A- Bishop Kelly, Pocatello; 3A-Kimberly, Snake River; 2A-Declo, Soda Springs; 1A Div I-Prairie, Cascade; and 1A Div II-Garden Valley, North Gem.

The three major areas of high school activities are weighted equally in determining recipients of the award.

The Academic Component is based on the varsity team's cumulative GPA as submitted on the State Academic Champions application for all IHSAA sponsored sports programs.

The Athletic/Activity Component is based on place of finish at IHSAA-sponsored state championships and activity program competitions.

The Citizenship Component is based on a school's self-evaluation of their citizenship/sportsmanship activities as submitted on an itemized form. Deductions are made by the IHSAA for player and/or coach unsportsmanlike ejections and also for unsportsmanlike school behavior at state tournaments.

In addition to the primary awards, schools that score 90% on the Citizenship Component and have no player/coach ejections or incidents of unsportsmanlike school behavior at state tournaments will receive an "Award of Excellence" certificate. The 2009-2010 Award of Excellence schools are Boise, Coeur d'Alene, Timberline, Shelley, Snake River, Declo, Cascade, Garden Valley, and Greenleaf Friends Academy.

STARTING DATE FOR 2010 FALL SPORTS

FOOTBALL: Schools playing the early game in football may begin football practice on Monday, August 9, AFTER submitting a written waiver request to the IHSAA. All other member schools may begin football practice on Friday, August 13. The first allowable date of competition for varsity football is Friday, August 27, provided there have been ten (10) days of practice. The day of the first scheduled contest shall not be allowed to count as one of the ten (10) days in meeting the ten-day practice rule. In football, helmets may be worn on the first day. A player must have at least two days of practice without any pads. Shoulder pads may be worn on the third day and full pads on the fifth day.

SOCCER: Practice may begin on Monday, August 9.

VOLLEYBALL & CROSS COUNTRY: Practice may begin on Friday, August 13.

ATTENTION ADMINISTRATORS

PRE & POST SEASON REGULATIONS

Administrators and athletic directors, please take every measure to inform your coaches and athletes of IHSAA Rules 17-2 thru 17-2-8.

17-2 Pre & Post Season Regulations Only in certain circumstances may school personnel be involved in practice or competition for IHSAA sponsored sports outside the sport season. The regulations listed below are in effect for any program in which students are instructed in the skills and techniques of a specific sport.

17-2-1 Students may participate in pre/post season activities during non-school time provided the following conditions are met:

- a. Attendance is limited to non-school time.
- b. Participation is strictly voluntary and is open to all high school students.
- c. All fees and expenses are provided by the student or his/her parents. No school funds, booster club funds (*except those raised by the student and his/her parents for that specific activity/event*) or other such funds can be used for entry fees, equipment, uniforms or transportation.
- d. Spectators are admitted without charge.
- e. Award limits and amateur regulations of the IHSAA are followed.

17-2-2 The School Year The school year is considered to be concluded after the last IHSAA spring sport state championship.

17-2-3 Rule of Two No more than two students may be coached at one time by a member of their high school (grades 9-12) staff of that sport during the school year. (i.e., A boys basketball coach may coach girls basketball players of the same school and vice versa.)

17-2-4 Pre-Season Coaching Coaches are not allowed to coach students of the school competitively (during competition) prior to the start of that sport season during the school year.

17-2-5 Summer Programs Summer programs must be voluntary and must be terminated before the first practice date of the high school sports season.

Rule 17-2-6 — Use of Protective Equipment

IHSAA member schools should be aware of Rule 17-2-6 concerning the use of protective equipment at clinics/camps. The Board of Directors allows schools to use their own protective equipment at camps and clinics upon written request from the trustees of the school. The rule and interpretation are as follows:

17-2-6 Protective Equipment No school-owned uniforms and/or protective equipment may be used without written permission from the IHSAA. With that permission, schools may use their own protective equipment in a camp or clinic for a period of one week upon written request from the trustees of the school. Included in the request shall be a statement of recognition that IHSAA sponsored catastrophic insurance provides no coverage for the activity and any and all liabilities rest solely with the school, camp, or clinic.

Individual students from a specific school are not required to use the school's protective equipment in the same camp as other team members. Each individual student will only be allowed to use an IHSAA member school's protective equipment by renting or loaning for a period of one week (seven consecutive days).

Schools must not rent protective equipment to students, camps, or clinics without written permission from the trustees of the school.

17-2-7 Summer Camps Students will only be allowed to attend team camps from the last day of IHSAA state competition to the last day of July.

17-2-8 Summer Moratorium Member schools are prohibited from hosting athletic camps involving students from IHSAA member schools during the month of August. Coaches from member schools are prohibited from working in or hosting athletic camps involving students from IHSAA member schools during the month of August.

Alan devoted thirty-nine years to providing quality programs for students, and continues his dedicated service to both District VI and the IHSAA.
