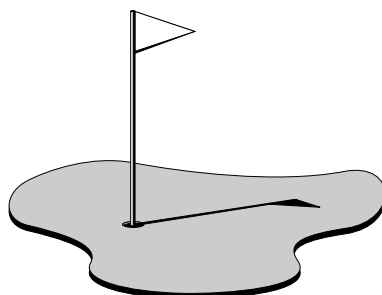

CLASSIFICATION

- 5A: 1280 and over in grades 9-12
- 4A: 1279 - 640 in grades 9-12
- 3A: 639 - 320 in grades 9-12
- 2A: 319 and under in grades 9-12

REPRESENTATION

Representation from district to state is based on the number of complete teams that actually participate at the district tournament. Representation for each district or regional tournament to state competition will be determined as follows:

<u>Teams In District Competition</u>	<u>Teams to State</u>
1-3	1
4-6	2
7-9	3
10-over	4

If only one team participates in a district, contact the IHSAA to determine qualifying procedures.

INDIVIDUAL QUALIFIERS

Individual Qualifiers Individuals may qualify for the state tournament in a number equal to the number of complete teams participating in the district tournament. Ex: Four complete teams compete at district - the four lowest scoring individuals qualify for State. If a tie exists in the final qualifying position, both individuals will advance.

(NEW) Honest Effort A golfer who starts, but does not finish, the district tournament, may be counted in determining the number of qualifying teams and individuals provided the manager determines that an honest effort was made and that the non-finish was due to circumstances beyond the golfer's control.

STATE TOURNAMENT FORMAT

All Classifications All teams and individuals will play 36 holes.

TEAM SCORING

Each school may enter five players, but the total strokes of four players will determine the team score. Final team scores will be a combined 36-hole score.

STARTING TIMES

All play will begin at 8:00 a.m.

LINE-UPS

Coaches must declare their team lineup by Thursday, May 13. Fax or email lineup to the appropriate tournament manager and also to the IHSAA (hammonsj@idhsaa.org, fax# 208-322-5505).

PRACTICE ROUNDS

There will be no official practice rounds scheduled for any classification on any golf course. Participants may play the golf course on their own any time prior to the starting time of the state tournament.

COACHES MEETING

It is important that all schools are represented at the pre-tournament coaches meeting. Some classifications will also host a barbeque for participants. Please contact the appropriate tournament manager for details.

THE RULES COMMITTEE

The rules committee will consist of the Rules Official, an IHSAA representative, and the host course pro or assistant pro.

AWARDS

<u>Teams</u>	Trophies will be awarded to the top four teams; medals will be awarded to the members of the first and second place teams; UDI Banners will be awarded to championship teams.
<u>Medalists</u>	Medals will be awarded to the top ten individuals finishers.

RAIN-OUT PLAN

<u>First Day</u>	All participants play 18 holes.
<u>Second Day</u>	If the course is unplayable, scores from the first round will determine team and medalist champions.

GOVERNANCE

USGA Rules of Golf will govern all tournament play, with allowed local course rules, and as modified by IHSAA rules.

STATE TOURNAMENT RULES

- Practice:
 - Qualifiers are not permitted to play the course, any hole, or to practice putt on a course green the same day as the tournament.
 - Practice between rounds is prohibited. Penalty for breach of rule is disqualification.
 - During a round, a player shall not play a practice stroke either during the play of a hole or between the play of two holes except that, between the play of two holes, the player may practice putting or chipping on or near any practice putting green or the teeing ground of the next hole to be played in the round, provided such practice stroke is not played from a hazard and does not unduly delay play.
 - Practice on or near the putting green of the hole last played is prohibited - penalty for breach of rule is two strokes. If a breach occurs between the play of two holes, the penalty will apply to the next hole.
 - A practice swing is not a practice stroke and may be taken at any location, provided the player does not breach the rules.
- Caddies: Caddies are not permitted during district or state tournament play.
- Carts: Carts are not permitted, except in case of special medical conditions. Permission to use a cart must be granted by the IHSAA or tournament manager.

4. Coaches:
 - a. Coaches may talk to players during the match and between nines, but they must not advise players about how to play a particular hole. Penalty for breach of rule is two strokes.
 - b. Coaches may offer technical advice and/or instruction only between holes and/or between nines. Penalty for breach of rule is two strokes.
 - c. Coaches are not allowed to play the course during the hours the state tournament is in progress.
 - d. Coaches should make an effort to help all participants abide by the rules of golf and the rules set up for district and state play. It is unethical to try to win a championship by disqualification.
5. Gallery: The gallery must be a reasonable distance (at least 25 feet) from the competitors at all times. Penalty for continued breach of gallery distance rule is one stroke.
6. Aiding a Competitor: There shall be no aiding of any competitor, except to look for a lost ball or provide relief items such as water, sunscreen, etc. Penalty for breach of rule is two strokes.
7. Sportsmanship: A player who violates the sportsmanship rules of golf will be assessed one penalty stroke for each unsportsmanlike act. Such acts include (but not limited to) profanity, throwing a club, damaging the course, etc.
8. Attire: All players must wear appropriate golfing attire — slacks or shorts and a collared shirt. Denim jeans are not permitted. Note: Mock-turtle golf-style shirts are also acceptable.
9. Electronic Devices: Competitors are not permitted wear headphones or use cell phones/pagers/range finders/GPS devices during tournament play. Penalty for breach of rule is two strokes.
10. Illegal Substances: The use of alcohol, tobacco or drugs is prohibited. Penalty for breach of rule is immediate disqualification.

SUPERVISION OF PLAY

1. A Rules Official will supervise each state tournament.
2. Adult volunteers will monitor play, but will not keep score or make rules interpretations. Volunteers may be provided using one of the following options:
 - a. One adult volunteer to follow each group. This individual must not be a coach or relative of any player in that group.
 - b. Eighteen adult volunteer monitors (if possible), one stationed at each green.
3. As each group finishes a hole, the assigned monitor will ask:
 - a. Are there any concerns regarding this hole?
 - b. Are you all in agreement on the scores of each player?
4. If there are concerns or reports of rules violations, the monitor will:
 - a. Attempt to resolve concerns through group discussion (volunteer will not make rule interpretation) or
 - b. Notify the Rules Official via cell phone of a possible rules violation.
 - c. The Rules Official will attempt to resolve issue before the group plays the next hole.
5. After the 18th hole, each group shall be escorted to the scoring area. Note: Coaches, spectators or other players will not be allowed in the scoring area.
6. The scoring area manager will have each group sit together and double-check their scorecards. He/she will then ask the group if anyone has questions or concerns about their round.
 - a. If there are no concerns, players will sign and turn in their scorecards. Note: Coaches may elect to review their players' scorecards before the cards are signed.
 - b. If there are concerns, players will be moved to a separate location until the issue can be resolved.
 - i. The Games Committee (Rules Official, IHSAA representative and host golf professional or assistant pro) will convene.
 - ii The golfer will state his/her concern in front of the entire group. If the concern is accusatory in nature, the committee will gather information and facts surrounding the issue by privately interviewing all players of the group.
 - iii Once the issue has been resolved, the coaches of each affected school will be notified of the Games Committee's decision, the players will sign their scorecards and will be released. Note: Coaches may elect to review their players' scorecards before the cards are signed.

SCORING

Rule 6-6 shall apply. Players in the foursome will be assigned as markers for another member of the foursome. Player 1 will score for 2, 2 will score for 3, 3 for 4, and 4 will score for 1. After each hole the marker should check the score with the competitor. On completion of the round the marker shall sign the card and hand it to the competitor.

The competitor shall check his score for each hole, settle any doubtful points with the Rules Committee, ensure that the marker has signed the card, countersign the card himself, and return it to the scorer's table under the procedure as listed above. The competitor is responsible for the correctness of the score recorded for each hole. Penalty for breach of Rule 6-6b is disqualification.

SCORECARDS

During all matches and tournaments, coaches should stress the importance of legible and accurate scorecards. Numbers must be written clearly. When a mistake is made in the recording of the hole-by-hole score, the mistake should be crossed out and the correct score written directly below the crossed out incorrect score. The correct score should never be written over the mistake. Before submitting the scorecard to the scoring manager, players must check to ensure scores are clearly legible and correct.

RESOLVING TIES AT STATE

1. All ties that occur at the end of regulation play for 1st – 4th team places and 1st place medalist will be resolved by a sudden-death playoff. The procedure is as follows:
 - a. Teams who are tied will play 5 golfers and score the 4 lowest individual scores. The team with the lowest combined team score after one hole will be declared the winner.
 - b. If the team score is still tied after the first playoff hole, the same procedure will be used for the remaining holes until the tie is broken.
 - c. Ties for first place medalist will be broken in the same manner as (b).
2. Ties for medalist places 2-10 will be resolved by use of a "card-off". The procedure is as follows:
 - a. The scores of the highest rated hole on the course will be compared. Individual with the lowest score on that hole will be declared the winner.
 - b. If a tie remains after the first card-off hole, scores on the second highest rated hole will be compared. This system will be continued until the tie is broken.
