

Larry Curry – 2004 Hall of Fame Inductee



Larry Curry made a positive and significant impact as a teacher, coach and administrator for thirty-six years. He taught and coached three years at Gooding and one year at Salmon River before moving to Kellogg in 1966. In his early years at Kellogg, Larry taught biology, was elementary school physical education coordinator, and coached basketball, golf, and football. In 1981, Larry moved into administration, serving as vice-principal and principal of Kellogg High School before becoming Superintendent of Schools in 1984, a position he held until retiring in 1997.

Perhaps Larry's greatest contribution to Idaho high school activities was his leadership in creating and implementing the Youth Endowment for Activities. His strong business sense and desire to provide a stable funding source for state tournament travel were driving forces for establishing an endowment that has been used as a model by many other states.
